SIMON KENWAY – ART SONG TO OPERA - Sunday March 22 - 2.00pm to 8.00pm

Due to circumstances beyond her control Nicole Panizza is unable to leave Ireland for March 22. While this is a disappointment we have been extremely lucky to pin down one of Australia's busiest musicians to take over on the day.

Coming to us with the enthusiastic recommendation of David Miller, NSW Guild President and senior lecturer in Ensemble Studies at the Sydney Con, **Simon Kenway** is a pianist first and then much more - conductor, repetiteur, vocal coach and accompanist. Read his bio and see for yourselves.

Naturally he will not be presenting Nicole's subject. He will bring a different perspective to our Seminar covering not one aspect of vocal repertoire but taking a more generalist approach to the repertoire for voice & piano from both **Art Song and Opera.**

We are so lucky to have found a Sydney pianist who will be able to prepare with **Teresa La Rocca** who is stationed in Sydney with Opera Australia and coming to Adelaide at the last minute for this Seminar and Recital. For the Recital they have begun rehearsals with Art Song for the first half and opera for the second.

Simon is an experienced vocal coach and frequently takes masterclasses for singers & pianists particularly at the Sydney Conservatorium. The masterclass is now open to a broader repertoire range — art song plus opera. For the pianist orchestral reductions can be just as taxing as the most difficult of art song accompaniments so duos can present arias /recits etc for the class. Pianists have much to learn from Simon about the pitfalls and joys of being an orchestra.
