Michael Kieran Harvey, pianist and composer, studied piano with Alan Jenkins in Canberra, Gordon Watson in Sydney and at the Liszt Academy, Budapest, under the Director, Professor Sándor Falvai. Harvey regularly appears with all Australian Symphony Orchestras. He has especially promoted the works of Australian composers and has premiered important international works including recording most of Messiaen's works with piano. His solo CDs have been released by Move, Tall Poppies and World Records has released a CD of American duos with violinist. Miwako Abe. His recordings are regularly nominated in the ARIAS and APRAS. Michael's awards include the Grand Prix in the Ivo Pogorelich Piano Competition (Pasadena), the Debussy Medal (Paris), four consecutive Australian "Mo" awards, the Australian government's Centenary Medal for services to Australian music and he has been twice nominated for the Helpmann Award. In 2005 the estate of the late Susan Remington established the Michael Kieran Harvey Scholarship to encourage future directions in keyboard art music. During the Accompanists' Festival Michael will emphasise his experiences in collaborative music making in recitals with:

Teresa La Rocca A graduate in Drama and Music from the Adelaide University and winner of the Herald Sun Aria and the Metropolitan Opera Award, Teresa has performed numerous operatic roles for State Opera SA, Bel Canto, Co-Opera and Opera Australia. As a soloist she has performed with the Sydney Philharmonia, Hong Kong Philharmonic and the Melbourne, Adelaide, Darwin and Willoughby Symphony Orchestras. In 2011, Teresa performs Lisa in *La Sonnambula* for SOSA and Berta in *Barber of Seville* and Donna Elvira in *Don Giovanni* for Opera Australia.

Natsuko Yoshimoto Concertmaster of the Adelaide Symphony Orchestra and former leader of the Australian and Grainger String Quartets and the Sydney Soloists, Natsuko won a scholarship to the Yehudi Menhuin School at age 11. She has since enjoyed a stellar performance career winning many international awards and performing as soloist with prestigious orchestras in the UK, Japan, Europe and Australia. A champion of new music Natsuko has premiere many Australian works. In their Friday recital she joins Michael in the premiere of his composition, "Fear".

Dale Ringland For over five decades, Dale Ringland has been associated with almost every major professional musical produced in Australia. Some premiere productions for which he was responsible include "Sweet Charity", "Man of La Mancha", "A Little Night Music", "Gypsy,""They're Playing Our Song", "La Cage aux Folles", "Anything Goes" and

"Me and My Girl". Dale performs regularly with the Adelaide Symphony Orchestra, The Adelaide Art Orchestra, State Opera of SA & the Adelaide Cabaret Festival. In 2010 Dale Received the Adelaide Critics' Circle Life Achievement Award. Dr Arabella Teniswood-Harvey performs as chamber musician, soloist and art/music lecture-recitalist in Australia the UK and the US. Studies in Performance (ANAM) and Art (PhD UT on the impact of music on Whistler's art) established her career as art/music historian/performer including articles published in *The British Art Journal, Music in Art*, and *The Burlington Magazine* (2011) and lecture-recitals in Glasgow, Washington, D.C. and Maine, USA. At home Arabella presents pre-concert talks for the Tasmanian Symphony Orchestra and teaches art theory, music history and piano at the University of Tasmania.
