Eligibility

All participants will be selected from primary school students who have reached a minimum standard equivalent to third grade AMEB and are currently taking lessons with a teacher.

- Participants must make themselves available for all sections
- Work(s) studied will be chosen by the Convenor in consultation with teachers
- Each group's program will be 5-8 minutes duration
- **Work(s) must be prepared before the first meeting and under the supervision of the teachers**
- **Assistance in preparation for the first rehearsal will be provided by the Guild if requested**
- Punctuality at all stages is essential for the smooth running of the program
- Participants must be keen to work with other musicians, respond positively to instruction and be prepared to take part in discussions
- **Following the final concert, participants are asked to write a short report on their experience in this venture and return it to the Convenor**

Masterclass

Presenter - KEITH CRELLIN

As the first violist to win the ABC Young Performers Award in 1972, Keith Crellin soon established himself as one of Australia's leading soloists and chamber music players. Having studied violin initially with Gretchen Schieblich and then Ladislav Jasek at the Queensland Conservatorium of Music, he completed his tertiary studies at the Tasmanian Conservatorium of Music under noted pedagogue Professor Jan Sedivka. In 1985, he became a founding member of the Australian String Quartet based in Adelaide, a position which he held for sixteen years and with which he performed in many countries. He has travelled widely throughout Australia and made numerous recordings.

Keith Crellin OAM held the position of Head of the String Department and Conductor in Residence at the Elder Conservatorium of Music at the University of Adelaide from 2001 – 2015. He has now retired from this post in order to concentrate more fully on his role as Managing Artistic Director of the Adelaide Youth Orchestra.
