The masterclass and first concert will be at Harrison Music Studio, 35A Orlando Ave, Hampstead Gardens

The final concert will be during AGSA Conference at **Marryatville High School**.

The Project will take place between March and June 2018 involving:

- A minimum of two rehearsal/lessons with the professional soloist
- A member from the Guild will be available as a mentor for each student if required
- A masterclass for all participating students
- A trial concert of the prepared work
- A second formal concert in the Accompanists' Conference.

Eligibility: Selection of pianists will be from those students who have reached a minimum standard equivalent to 7th grade AMEB and above.

- Students must currently be taking lessons with a teacher who will assist their preparation
- Participants must make themselves available for all dates indicated
- Work(s) studied will be chosen by the Convenor in consultation with teachers
- Each participant's program will be between 5 to 8 minutes duration
- Work must be prepared in advance of the first rehearsal under the supervision of the participant's piano teacher
- Assistance in preparation for the first rehearsal will be provided by the Guild if requested
- Punctuality at all stages is essential for the smooth running of the program
- Participants must be keen to work with other musicians, respond positively to instruction and be prepared to take part in discussions
- Following the final concert, participants are required to write a short report on their experiences in this program
- 5MBS will record the concert on June 16 and each YAS participant will receive a CD.

The Masterclass will be conducted by Dr **Diana Weekes** who has performed for the ABC. Recitals Australia, the Adelaide Festival and Barossa Music Festivals. Formerly a lecturer in music at the Flinders Street School of Music. from 2002 to 2010 she was a Senior Lecturer in Keyboard at the Elder Conservatorium. Coordinator of the Chamber Music program, and Head of Undergraduate Studies. Widely experienced in the art of duo piano playing and accompanying, she completed a PhD in musical composition in 2007. From 2011 Diana joined the part-time staff and continued her piano teaching; she also supervised several PhD candidates and in 2013–14 acted as Coordinator of the Honours Research Seminar.

The focus of the 2018 Conference is 2 Piano works with guest artists in residence Lisa Moore and Sonya Lifschitz. They will be presenting at the AGSA Conference and then give a recital at Elder Hall on Sunday 17 June.
